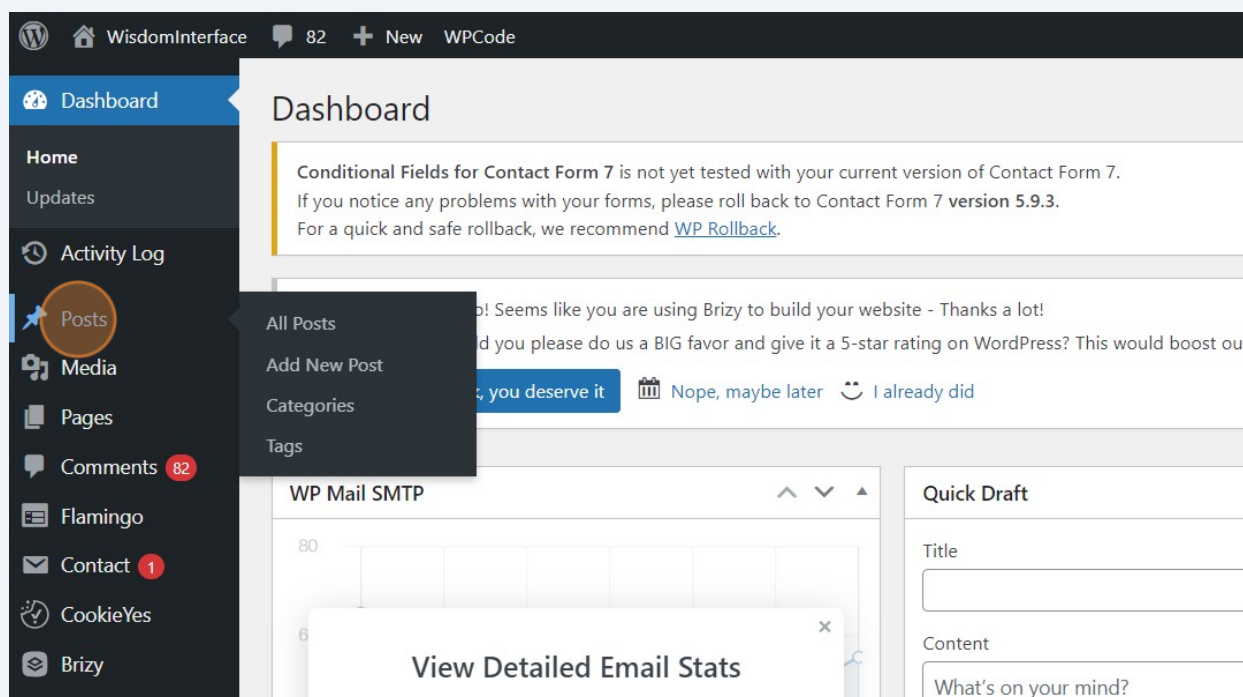


Edit and Update Post Name on WisdomInterface Platform

- 1 Open Dashboard and Click on "Posts" or "Page". Where you want to add "Favicon"




2 Click on "Edit"


